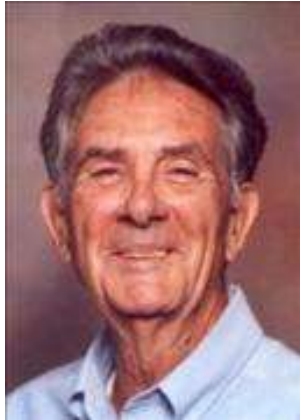


MSG (Ret) Bobby Lee Bomar

Funeral for retired Master Sgt.
