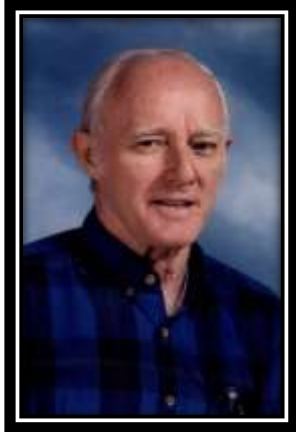


# SFC (Ret) Martin Joseph Mclsaac

September 3, 1934 - November 17, 2009



Age 75, Lawton - Services will be 11:30 a.m. Tuesday at the Holy Family Catholic Church with Rev. Joseph R. Ross, Pastor of Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church, officiating Sergeant Mclsaac died Tuesday at his home. Burial with full military honors will be at Fort Sill National Cemetery, Elgin, under the direction of the Becker Funeral Home. There will be a wake service 7:00 p.m. Monday at the funeral home.

SFC Mclsaac was born September 3, 1934 in Waterbury, Connecticut to Harold and Genevieve (Neilan) Mclsaac. He attended SSPP Parochial School and graduated with the class of 1952 at Crosby High School. He joined the Army in 1956 with two tours of duty in Vietnam, two in Germany and one in Panama. He retired at Fort Dix, New Jersey in 1977. He earned the Bronze Star Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Good Conduct Medal, 5th Award, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal, Vietnam Cross of Gallantry with Palm, Presidential Unit Citation, and the Sharpshooters Medal. He married Mary Pauline Russell in 1971 in Prospect, Connecticut. He was employed by the Lawton Public Schools from 1987 until 1999.

He is survived by his wife, of the home; two sons and a daughter in law, Eric N. Mclsaac of Irving, Texas and Keith M. and Kimberly Mclsaac of Lawton; two grandchildren, Caden A. Mclsaac and Kelsey B. Mclsaac; two brothers and sisters-in-law, Harold J. and Nori Mclsaac and H. Donald and Lenore Mclsaac all of Waterbury, Connecticut; and several nieces and nephews. His parents preceded him in death.
